




Public Education in California – 40 Years Later

Demographics of our K-12 Students

- ▶ In the US over the last decade there are 4.3 million less white students and 4.6 more Latino students
- ▶ Since December 15, 1999, California has been a majority minority state
- ▶ In Santa Clara County, 174,000 residents are undocumented (8 percent of the workforce). Over 50 percent of immigrants have been here since 1999.
- ▶ In Santa Clara County, one in seven students has an undocumented parent.
